

Guidelines for the Grading of International Officials

Effective from 1 June 2018

1. **Definitions and General Requirements**

- 1.1 This grading document covers all official's categories:
 - (a) Technical Officials (Technical Delegate, Technical Officer and Judge);
 - (b) Umpire Manager;
 - Umpire and Video Umpire (c)
- 1.2 All candidates must:
 - 1. Be active as an official at the top level of an FIH affiliated National Association, not necessarily their own and active at their Continental Federation
 - 2. Have a complete knowledge of the latest issue of The Rules of Hockey and relevant tournament regulations;
 - 3. Be able to understand and communicate in English.
- 1.3 If an official is not active in their own country or continental federation, or has not been appointed in 3 consecutive years, the official will be become inactive until their activity has been restored. The official may then be reinstated as an international official and their panel designation will be based on performance.
- 1.4 For the purposes of these Grading Guidelines, it should be noted that the final decision regarding all upgrades rests with the Officials Committee.

2. Additional role-specific requirements for entering the FIH Officials Pathways










3. The Panel Structure

3.1 The purpose of the Panels for Officials is to have a current and transparent panel systems which can support the FIH and CF event portfolio with excellent officials. The panel structure comprises all categories of FIH Officials. It is performance-based in nature and illustrates the officials' current performance levels.





- 3.3 The arrows indicate how the career path can develop based on performances. The panel structure is fluid which means officials can move around panels based on performance.
- 3.4 The World Cup Panel is populated when appointments for the World Cup are made. Similary, the Olympic Panel is populated when appointments for the Olympic Games are made. Both Panels will be populated from officials from the Pro League Panel and the International Elite Panel. Officials will return to the original panel once the World Cup or Olympic Games are completed.
- 3.5 The Olympic Panel and the World Cup Panel, the Pro League Panel, the International Elite Panel and the Advancement Panel is operationally handled by the FIH. The International Panel and the Talent Development Panel is operationally handled by the CF under the FIH regulations from this document.
- 3.6 All panels contain specific performance criteria which determines the direction and progress of the official's development. This is supplemented by an educational/development program linked to each panel. Part of the performance criteria is to participate successfully in these development activities.
- 3.7 The position of active FIH Official will cease on 31 December following reaching the age of 65 years. This will have effect from 31st December 2019 allowing CF's to plan over the course of 2019 for a smooth transition into the new set-up.



4. Definitions

4.1 In the following paragraphs the various criteria for the panels are defined. For clarity, the following definitions are specified below

5. Talent Development Panel TDP

In order to identify and promote talented officials globally earlier, the TDP is established on a continental basis but in line with an FIH developed training program. The overall aim is to produce officials, who within 5-6 years can reach Pro League Panel level.

5. International Panel IP

The purpose of the International Panel IP is to provide CF with qualified officials and to bring onboard talented national officials into the international hockey event environment.

The IP is the first international grading. Upon being appointed to this panel, the official will receive the insignia/badge from the FIH through a recommendation from the CF.

This panel is governed by the CF. NAs will forward applications to the CF when qualification criteria for an official is met. The FIH finally approves the upgrade based on the recommodation from the CF.

6. Advancement Panel AP

The purpose of the Advancement Panel is to develop and fast track high potential officials into the Pro League Panel or the International Elite Panel.

7. International Elite Panel IEP

The purpose of the International Elite Panel IEP is to nurture the very experienced official that services events to a high standard. The IEP may contain top class officials that for family/work reasons cannot accommodate the high dedication requirements (travel & time) of the Hockey Pro League.



8. Pro League Panel PLP

The purpose of the Pro League Panel is to service the Hockey Pro League and other high profile league-based entertainment types of events. Being listed on this panel means a high level of performance but also a high level of commitment to the substantially more demanding pro set-up.

The Hockey Pro League officials will be appointed mainly from the PLP and officials from the World Cup Panel and the Olympic Panel if these are established.

The Pro League Panels consist of maximum:



- 40 Technical Officials
- 20 Umpire Managers
- 30 umpires (female)
- 30 umpires (male)

The list is evaluated at various stages through the year.

9. The World Cup Panel WCP & The Olympic Games Panel OGP

The purpose of the The World Cup Panel and the Olympic Games Panel is the to celebrate and maintain the pinnacle of international hockey officiating. To increase quality and competition amongst the candidates, there is a limited number of places available on these panels. The panels will be populated based on appointments made to the Olympic Games or the World Cup. Appointments are primarily made from but not limited to the PLP and the IEP.

After the completion of the World Cup or Olympic Games, the officials will return to the panels based on performance and HPL availability.
